

## **Monday Morning Practice Pearls #4**

## What does building "wiggle room" into your protocol procedure time points really mean?

Without wiggle room for protocol specific procedures, including drug administration, you may end up with multiple protocol deviations that need to be submitted to the IRB. It is not always possible to build wiggle room into a protocol as the specific time of the procedure is critical to patient safety and efficacy. Many of our protocol procedures have rigid time points that a procedure must be completed in, but many can safely allow for some compromising or wiggle room. Below are some examples you can suggest to your PI so that you ultimately avoid having a protocol deviation.

- Protocol states that labs are to be collected on a specific day for example Day 8. Can you add a
  +/- 2 days so that it would be CBC on Day 8 +/- 2 days allowing the CBC to be collected anytime
  between Day 6-10?
- If the patient is taking their own daily BP, must it be collected every day or is there room to allow for a few missed time points? What is considered being compliant? For example: patient will take their own BP daily while at home allowing for 15% missed reading.
- The study drug is self-administered by the patient. At what point will the PI consider the patient non-compliant with medication administration (e.g., missing <20% of the doses in a given cycle)?
- Your protocol states that screening labs and PE will be done 7 days prior to starting therapy. Your protocol states that Day 1 labs and PE are needed, but your PI says these aren't needed since labs and PE were done 7 days ago. Amend protocol to remove the Day 1 procedures.
- Avoid giving exact times (e.g., 8 AM) when multiple drugs or pre-medications/hydration is part
  of your protocol. Instead, indicate the number of minutes or hours in between the drugs, premeds and/or hydration and include a +/- times.
- For study medications given on multiple days, indicate the start time of each study medication can be within a certain amount of time (e.g. study medication start times for drugs given once daily should be given within 2 hours of the scheduled time or study medication start times for drugs given more than once daily should be given within one hour of schedule time).
- Consider building in room for non-AE treatment delays (e.g., weather, vacation) during a cycle or delay in starting the next cycle. Maybe +/- 1 week for vacation and +/- 3 days for weather.
