

19/28 patient representatives (68% response rate)




Meeting Frequency and Attendance

- 10 patient representatives (53% of survey respondents, 36% of all patient representatives) reported their group did not meet in the past 6 months
- Even in groups that met, most respondents were not able to attend all meetings



Patient Representative Satisfaction


- 10/19 (53%) of respondents felt that their experience had not met their expectations
- For patient representative in working groups that have met over the past 6 months,
 6/9 (66%) of respondents said the experience met or exceeded their expectations

Only 1 respondent would definitely not want to continue in their current working group


Would you like to continue with your current working group?





Addressing Patient Representative Concerns

- 12/19 (64%) of respondents indicated that they would like the opportunity to participate in a different working group
 - 6 did not want to continue or were unsure about continuing on their current working group (i.e. potentially want to change working groups)
 - 6 wanted to continue in primary working group (i.e. potentially want to serve on multiple working groups)





Addressing Patient Representative Concerns

- Implement plan to allow patient reps to switch groups or serve on multiple groups
- Re-assess participation across working groups; identify those who don't want to continue
- Potentially recruit new patient representatives to fill gaps
