Purpose: Provide additional protection for sensitive information obtained during the conduct of biomedical, behavioral or clinical research.

Step 1: Collect and prepare necessary documents

- - Prepare the protocol and consent (initial IRB application or amendment) with the required wording
 - Obtain "conditional" IRB approval with an IRB (iRIS) approval memo.
 - Obtain the PI and Scientific Director's signature on the cover letter of the application.
 - O Submit the application with the IRB approval memo, protocol and consent to the IC Certificate Coordinator (http://grants.nih.gov/grants /policy/coc/contacts.htm).
 - Upon approval of the application, submit approval in iRIS.
